

JAMFACTORY PRIVATE GROUP WORKSHOPS



Private Group Workshops at JamFactory Adelaide

Immerse yourself within a professional studio environment with a hands-on experience guided by skilled tutors in a relaxed and creative atmosphere.

All sessions are suitable for complete beginners and all required tools and materials are supplied. Please enquire for available dates.

Optional add-on: guided tour of JamFactory

\$5 per person ~ approximately 30 minutes

Take a behind-the-scenes tour of JamFactory's four working studios, gallery and retail store ~ includes 10% off all retail purchases made in-store on the day of booking.

DURATION: 2 HOURS

brass paperclip / bookmark

\$85 pp

participants per group: minimum 7 - maximum 22

Held in JamFactory's Metal and Jewellery studio, participants will receive an introduction to the tools and materials required to make a folded bookmark or paperclip out of brass. Skills and techniques such as sawing, filing and polishing metal to achieve different finishes and textures will be covered and participants will have the option to customise their piece with stamped initials or lettering.

wheel throwing demonstration

\$60 pp

participants per group: minimum 7 - maximum 10

A hands-on introduction to the process of centering and throwing clay on a potters wheel; participants will receive a detailed demonstration of the various stages of centering and shaping on the wheel as well as an overview of the properties of clay as a material before having the opportunity to practice the throwing process themselves.

please note that pieces will not be finished/kept and all clay used during the session will be recycled

hand building workshop

\$160 pp

participants per group: minimum 7 - maximum 12

In this introduction to hand-built ceramics, participants will be guided through slab construction methods and forming pieces with plaster moulds as well as various surface decoration techniques to create and customise their own clay pieces in a range of forms such as a small bowl, side plate and a cup or mug.

students can expect to make up to 3 pieces, with work to be glazed/fired at JamFactory for collection approximately 2 weeks after the session date

DURATION: 2.5 HOURS

brass business card holder

\$110 pp

participants per group: minimum 7 - maximum 22

Held in JamFactory's Metal and Jewellery studio, participants will receive an introduction to the tools and materials required to make a simple business card or photo holder out of folded brass. Skills and techniques such as sawing, filing, forming and polishing metal to achieve different finishes will be covered and participants will have the option to make simple customisations to the shape of their chosen piece.

DURATION: 1 DAY (5 HOURS)

planter workshop

\$200 pp

participants per group: minimum 7 - maximum 12

Participants will be guided through different hand-building techniques in coiling, pinching and slab construction to create a series of small to medium plant vessels of different forms and surface texture, with the option of customising pieces with drainage holes, matching drip-trays and holes or attachments for hanging planters.

Students can expect to complete 1-3 individual plant pots which will be glazed and fired by JamFactory for collection after the workshop date; students will have the opportunity to select from a variety of glazes.

tea set workshop

\$200 pp

participants per group: minimum 7 - maximum 12

Create your own individual set of ceramic pieces for serving tea or coffee in this hands-on ceramics workshop. Participants will be guided through different hand building methods such as coiling, pinching and slab construction to create a five-piece set including a mug, cup, saucer, tea-strainer and teaspoon.

Students can expect to complete 3-5 pieces depending on their chosen size and complexity. Finished pieces will be glazed and fired in JamFactory's Ceramics Studio to be collected after the workshop date; students will have the opportunity to select from a variety of glazes.

DURATION: 1 DAY (6 HOURS)

silver ring making

\$250 pp

participants per group: minimum 7 - maximum 22

An introduction to basic silver jewellery making skills and techniques such as sawing, filing, forming a soldering a sterling silver ring to your individual measurements. Each participant will have the opportunity to make and take home their own ring made to size, individualized through application of their chosen surface texture and finish.

Please note that you may be using materials that can stain clothes; we recommend bringing an apron for wheel-throwing courses in particular. All tools, materials and safety equipment (if required) are provided.


